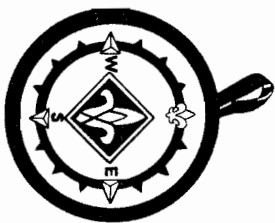


Webelos Resident Camp returns to a 4-day / 3-night Summer Camp Experience just for 1st & 2nd year Webelos Scouts in 2008!

This summer, Webelos Resident Camp is 4 days & 3 nights of nothing but fun in the outdoors, at the Manatoc Scout Reservation's Camp Manatoc, located within the Cuyahoga Valley National Park.

Resident Camp is a chance for Webelos Scouts to experience the adventure waiting for them in a week of Boy Scout Summer Camp. It's days filled with exciting activities like swimming, boating, rafting, archery, BB-gun marksmanship, hiking, fire-building, trying your hand on a BMX/mountain bike course, working on at least 4 different Activity Badges...REALLY! - and so much more.



Where you'll sleep

Campers will sleep just like our Boy Scouts do, in 2-man canvas tents on wooden platforms, in the same campsites used by our Boy Scout troops. Webelos Scouts will camp as a unit under their own adult leadership. The required youth to adult ratio is 3 youth to 1 adult leader — and the BSA's 2-deep leadership policy also applies.

Resident Camp Fees

Youth can attend individually or with their pack or den — cost is \$100 per Webelos Scout and \$55 per adult. Registration forms and fees are due by July 7, 2008 — fees paid after July 7 are \$115 per Scout and \$70 per adult. All fees are non-refundable.

Your meals during camp...

For both sessions of Webelos Resident Camp, all but two of your meals will be provided, family-style, in the more-than-70-year-old Dining Hall. Like the stockade Main Gate, it is one of Manatoc's most famous landmarks.

However, your first meal in camp will be the "Family Night" potluck supper in your campsite — families are invited from 5 p.m. on to watch Retreat on the Parade Field then have dinner with their Scout and visit the camp program areas — the evening concludes with the Opening Campfire Program on the Parade Field.

Your final meal will be breakfast on the last day of your stay. In all, you'll enjoy 8 meals (including the "Family Potluck") and 3 evening "cracker barrel" snacks during your time at Resident Camp. Campers with severe dietary restrictions should indicate that on their registration form — our staff will do jts best to meet your needs.

What you'll need at camp:

- Cub/Webelos Scout Uniform.
- Medical Exam Class 1 & 2 (complete & current) - Class 1 for all youth and all adults (on-line at www.gtcbasa.org, Resources, National Forms)
- Prescription medicines (in original bottles)
- Sleeping Bag (or 3 good blankets) & pillow
- Cot (preferred) or sleeping pad
- Change of clothes (x 3) & sleeping clothes
- Jacket / Sweatshirt / Hoodie
- Sneakers & Hiking Boots
- Swim Trunks & Towel
- Flashlight
- Raingear
- Canteen or water bottle
- Personal items — soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, comb/brush, insect repellent (lotion), sunscreen
- Webelos Scout Book
- Spending money for Trading Post (approx. \$25)

during your stay at
Webelos Resident Camp:**

DAY 1

Check-in at camp from 1 p.m. till 4 p.m.
Campsite set-up, group photo, brief orientation walk, swim tests
and medical re-checks.

Retreat Ceremonies followed by "Family Night" potluck supper in
the campsite—families invited from 5 p.m. on to watch Retreat
on the Parade Field then have dinner with their Scout and visit
camp program areas—evening concludes with Opening Camp-
fire Program on Parade Field.

DAY 2

*** Breakfast in Dining Hall ***
Morning — Activity Badge Programs in individual camp Program
Areas

*** Lunch in Dining Hall ***
Afternoon — Open Program Areas (archery, BB, pool, lakefront,
handicraft, Scoucraft, BMX/Mountain Biking, Color Trail Hikes,
personal or group activities)

*** Dinner in Dining Hall & Retreat Ceremonies ***
Evening — Open Program Areas then Cracker Barrel snack in
campsite followed by Lights Out

DAY 3

*** Breakfast in Dining Hall ***
Morning — same as Day 2

*** Lunch in Dining Hall or "in the field" ***
Afternoon — same as Day 2

*** Dinner in Dining Hall & Retreat Ceremonies ***
Evening — same as Day 2 w/Last Night Campfire Ceremony

DAY 4

*** Breakfast in Dining Hall ***
"Camper Roundtables" followed by Closing Ceremony then
campsite tear-down, pack up and depart for home by 10 a.m.
